Supervision and Field Review of Surveys

Each supervisor will review the quality of each surveyor's work under his supervision at least three times a year and make a report to the area conservationists with a copy to the state soil scientist of his recommendations and instructions. It is also suggested that they prepare reports on special assignments.

The state soil scientist or his assistants will help on special problems.
